Then others were made with parish changes:-

Abbots Barton (from 1894), Avington, Chilcombe Without (from 1894), Fair Oak (from 1894), Lainston, Stoke Park (from 1899), Winchester (from 1902).

The population falling within the union at the 1831 census had been 16,807 with parishes ranging in size from Morestead (population 90) to Winchester St Thomas (1,665).

The average annual poor-rate expenditure for the period 1832-35 had been £10,312 or 12s.3d. per head.
